Post WW2, the town flourished through to the 1970's



By the 1980's with affordable flights to the continent and USA Scarborough failed to keep up with the competition.

Dropping prices and lowering standards was considered the future.

Tourism business yields dropped, hotels closed and the community began to suffer.





The community became fractured. State school results were poor, unemployment increased, aspirations were low and many moved to the area from the city regions to be `unemployed by the sea.'





Ageing population – creating an imbalance on healthcare demands – many employers also experiencing an older age profile and struggling to fill vital roles from the local area as the educational providers were not supplying work ready candidates
